College Rules and Guidelines

- Students are required to attend classes at college regularly.
- General rules of discipline are to be strictly followed at the college.

- Respective Departments will provide teaching plans to the students at the starting of each session which shall help them appear for classes with a certain degree of preparation.

New Regulations for 3y/4y B.A./B.Sc./B.Com Course

The University of Calcutta is going to introduce semester wise Three-year B.A./B.Sc Multidisciplinary & B.Com courses of studies and Four-year B.A./B.Sc.(Honours & Honours without research) courses of studies. There are few important changes in course structure, attendance regulations and grading system. Students are requested to keep in mind some basic regulations for smooth completion of their studies.

Syear B.A./B.Sc.(Multidisciplinary) Course

Duration of the programme

- The B.A./B.Sc multidisciplinary program shall be for a minimum duration of six consecutive semesters with exit option after 2nd and 4th semester.
- A student pursuing a regular course of study for semester wise degree course shall have to clear all semesters within a span of seven years from the year of admission of that particular course or combination.

Types of subjects

- <u>Core Course (CC):</u> The students should select two subjects as core subjects (CC1 & CC2) and they have to take sixteen (16) core courses from the two subjects, taking eight (8) from each core subject.
- <u>Minor</u>: The students should select another one subject as minor other than the two core subjects and they have to study six (6) courses from the minor subject.
- <u>Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC)</u>: The students will have to opt for three IDCs (one in each of the first three semester) which should be different from the core & the minor subjects.
- <u>Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):</u> The students shall have to study three (3) SECs from each of the two core and one minor subjects taken.
- <u>Common Value Added Course (CVAC)</u>: The students shall study four (4) CVAC courses. In the 1st semester they have to study one compulsory CVAC in ENVS and another one in Constitutional values. In the 2nd semester, there shall be one compulsory CVAC in ENVS and another one should be selected from the pool of courses.
- <u>Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)</u>: The students shall have to study four AEC courses among which two compulsory AEC courses named Compulsory English should be studied in 1st and 2nd semester and the optional AEC should be studied in 3rd and 4th semester.

A student taking up multidisciplinary courses of studies for B.A. degree shall study both the core subjects and minor subjects from the humanities discipline or any two of the three subjects from the humanities discipline and the other from the science discipline.

A student taking up multidisciplinary courses of studies for B.Sc. degree shall study both the core subjects and minor subjects from the Science discipline or any two of the three subjects from the science discipline and the other from the humanities discipline.

4year B.A./B.Sc.(Honours with or without Research)

Duration of the programme

- The B.A./B.Sc program shall be for a minimum duration of eight (08) consecutive semesters with exit option after 2nd/4th/6th semester.
- A student pursuing a regular course of study for semester wise degree course shall have to clear all semesters within a span of seven years from the year of admission of that particular course or combination.

Types of subjects

- <u>Major Courses:</u> The students shall have to take twenty two (22) discipline specific core courses (DSCC) from the major subject. Students who do not qualify/ opt for 4year B.A./B.Sc. by research will have to take three additional courses with provisions for project based evaluation.
- Minor Courses: The students should have to select two subjects as minor subjects (m1, m2) from the same broad discipline as major and should study eight (08) minor courses among which two minor courses from m1 in 1st & 2nd semester, two minor courses from m2 in 3rd & 4th semester and four minor courses (two courses in each semester taken from two different minor subjects) in 5th & 6th semester.
- Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC): The students will have to opt for three IDCs (one in each of the first three semester) which should be different from the major & the minor subjects.
- Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): The students shall have to study three (3) SECs. In 1st and 3rd semester, they should have to study 2 SECs based on their major subjects. In 2nd semester, they can study Artificial Intelligence (Science discipline) or Digital Empowerment (Humanities and Language discipline) or as specified in the syllabus for concerned major subject.
- <u>Common Value Added Course (CVAC)</u>: The students shall study four (4) CVAC courses. In the 1st semester they have to study one compulsory CVAC in ENVS and another one in Constitutional values. In the 2nd semester, there shall be one compulsory CVAC in ENVS and another one should be selected from the pool of courses.
- Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): The students shall have to study four AEC courses among which two compulsory AEC courses named Compulsory English should be studied in 1st and 2nd semester and the optional AEC should be studied in 3rd and 4th semester.

Types of subjects

• <u>Research/Dissertation</u>: Students obtaining CGPA equivalent to 75% marks after successful completion of all the first six semesters may opt for honours with research degree course in the 7th and 8th semester.

Students taking up major and minor subjects from science discipline shall pursue B.Sc. degree course and students taking up major and minor subjects from humanities and language discipline shall pursue B.A. degree course. If the major and the minor subjects taken by a student are a combination of both the discipline then she/he will pursue a B.Sc. degree course.

For any type of unwanted incidence like ragging, sexual harassment or minority rights violations, or examination related grievances students can go to the grievances portal in sundarbanmahavidyalaya.in and register themselves to lodge complains.

FeedBack

A robust feedback system has been developed to collect feedback from the students, teachers and alumni, analyzed appropriately and actions are taken accordingly for the overall development of academics as well as administration of the institution. Students' feedback is collected twice a year, after completion



of each semester on teaching-learning procedure, requirement of infrastructure, course outcome etc.

Hostel facility for Girls'

Sundarban Mahavidyalaya Girls' Hostel is in the adjacent premises of the College It starts its journey from July, 2019 for backing the girl students who are coming from a less privileged family. Admission to the hostel is strictly based on distance from hometown, merit, and person with Disability.
